

Letter from Henry Pomeroy - Lay Reader

Rock House, Horn Street, Nunney

Does the news of a general election fill you with excitement, trepidation or just a sense of general apathy and confusion? And as Christians, shouldn't we just trust in God and avoid the murky world of politics?

An election is a golden opportunity for the Church to show up and engage. God calls us to love our neighbours (Mark 12:31) and be salt and light for the world (Matthew 5:13-16). We're explicitly told to do justice (Micah 6:8) and to pray for those in authority (1 Timothy 2:1-2).

The Bible does not tell us how to vote – that is up to our own conscience – but in the light of these instructions, it's clear we should get involved.

When politics is often seen as divisive, and it's considered normal to dehumanise those we don't agree with, we as Christians have a unique opportunity to focus on what unites us and see the human behind the hate. The 18th century preacher John Wesley said: "I met those of our society who had votes in the ensuing election, and advised them 1. To vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy; 2. To speak no evil of the person they voted against, and 3. To take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side."

We could do well to follow John Wesley's advice!

Letter from Bishop Michael

A richness of ministry

If we're all alike we tend to think the same. This can be comfortable and reassuring - 'Everyone around here sees things just like I do'. But it doesn't help us think out of the box or worse, spot risks and dangers of which we're unaware - 'Crumbs we never saw that one coming!'. For this reason, companies and all kinds of organisations are seeking to become more diverse. Having differing viewpoints, skills and abilities is increasingly recognised to grow ability to think not only more widely but more effectively too.

Recognising diversity has been very much part of our life here in our Diocese of Bath & Wells during recent weeks. Back in May we acclaimed the 30^{th} anniversary of the ordination of women to the priesthood. It's almost impossible now to imagine what our Church would be like without the contribution of women throughout the ordained ministry. At the end of June the 'Celebration of Lay Ministries' held at St Paul's Weston-super-Mare saw us affirm, thank and bless the many different roles and responsibilities that lay people are undertaking across our churches and in local communities – from leading worship to pastoral care, ministry with children and young people to preaching and teaching the faith. Again, it's almost impossible to imagine what our churches would be like without such richness.

Our hope is that the diversity we've been honouring will only flourish and grow. For it's essential if we're to bring the light of the Gospel to everyone in our communities – and especially those we find hard to connect with. For none of us alone, either individually or as a group, has the ability to reach everyone. All of us are needed. It's for this reason that one of the priorities we're commending across our diocese is 'shared local ministry'. This recognises that everyone, everywhere, has a contribution to make. Now surely that's something to celebrate!

Stoke Church PCC- notes from meeting held on 18.6.24

In the interest of being open and keeping our community informed of what's going on at church here is an abridged version of the draft minutes from the last PCC meeting. Any questions arising from these notes, please get in touch with the Churchwardens.

Vacancy update- We said farewell to Anthony in May, as he and Christine retired and moved away. Paul Richards is acting as chair of PCC during the vacancy. The recruitment process for a new Vicar starts at the end of June when PCC members from across the church group will meet with Diocesan staff to hear about the process. We shall know more about what is required after that meeting, but will be working with the group of churches to find our new Vicar! There are also monthly prayer meetings to hold the plans before God and to seek his guidance- please ask Churchwardens if you would like to join us. In the mean time we continue with our usual service pattern and are grateful for our stand-in Vicars (who are mainly local retired Vicars), and they will be available for weddings, baptisms and funerals when required.

Pastoral team- working with the other churches in the group we have set up a small team of people who can offer care and support to members of the parish who are in need of care and a listen ear- for example after a bereavement. Justine North is the Stoke team member. Do talk to her if you feel you would like that kind of support or know someone who would benefit from it

Fabric- The Dove window has now been removed for repairs, and it should take 6 to 8 weeks before it will be replaced. There is a large amount of work required in the church to keep it in good order (including repairs to the vestry and porch roofs, rendering, repairs to other windows, repairs to the tower and updating the utility area). We estimate the cost will run into several hundred thousand pounds. We are seeking advice from the Diocese about funding such a large amount from such a small congregation

Fundraising- every penny counts! We have 2 special events over the summer and proceeds will help with our every day running costs:

- "An evening of summer music"- we welcome Sing Your Heart Out choir for a concert on 5th July- see elsewhere for details. Tickets still available
- Stoke Fest- church will be running the Tea Tent at this village event on 17th August. If you can contribute a cake or help out for an hour on the day please let Justine know



East Mendip Gardening Club

July brings long, warm days that continue late into the evening perfect for pottering in the garden after work, hosting barbecues, and enjoying your beds and borders as they reach their peak.

Summer can still throw out a few surprises — make sure tall plants and climbers are well supported in case of bad weather.

Water at dusk to reduce evaporation and use mulch to retain moisture around plants.

Terracotta pots are prone to evaporation so dampen the pot down to keep roots inside cool and damp.

Prune wisteria now. Just remove the whippy side-shoots from the main branch framework to about 20cm from their base (about five leaves from the main stem).Divide clumps of bearded Iris so they have time to form roots and flower buds for next year before the cold weather arrives. Take cuttings from your favourite tender plants for overwintering indoors. Cuttings can also still be taken from shrubs and border perennials.

Look out for clematis wilt. Symptoms include wilting leaves and black discolouration on the leaves and stems. Cut out all affected material and dispose of it in your household waste.

Pepper plants will benefit from being potted on into progressively larger pots.

Train cucumber stems upwards to make the most of the space available. Simply tie in their long stems to vertical wires or use cane supports to create a wigwam of poles.

If you're growing aubergines, pinch out the growing tip once they have 5 or 6 fruits. Pick fruits while they are young. You can expect to start harvesting mid to late summer. PTO Nip off the growing tips of squash and courgette plants to encourage branching.

Pick, dry and freeze herbs for using later in the year.Check the leaves of gooseberry bushes for sawfly larvae, which can completely strip the foliage in a matter of days. Jet them off with water or pick them off by hand.

Prune your stone fruit trees like plum, apricot, peach and cherry now. Pruning these species in the summer reduces the risk of silver leaf disease.

Raspberries are shallow rooted so they'll appreciate being watered generously in hot, dry weather.

This is your last chance to feed your lawn with a special lawn fertiliser to encourage healthy green growth.

If your plants are wilting for no obvious reason, check for vine weevils by tipping your plants out of their pots and looking for 'C' shaped creamy maggots amongst the roots. Treat with nematodes if vine weevils are spotted.

July is the ideal time to sow spring and summer-flowering perennial seeds for next year in trays filled with good quality compost. of beetroot and fast maturing carrots now in time for an autumn harvest.

Sow French beans and runner beans if space allows — this will extend your cropping season well into the autumn. Direct sow or start them off in small pots. Expect to start harvesting in late August.

Add some colour to your plot by direct sowing Swiss chard 'Bright Lights'. This will over-winter to give a bumper crop in the spring.

Plant out sprouting broccoli, spacing the plants 60cm (2ft) apart. Calabrese plants can be spaced closer together at 30cm (1ft) apart.

Allow about 45cm between winter cabbages, plants as they get quite big!

With vegetable gardens full of produce and borders at their peak, you'll be busy watering, monitoring for pests, and keeping on top of weeds. If you're planning a holiday, invest in an irrigation system to look after fruit, flowers and veg while you're away.
