Confused with the name?

The commonly used name is Leigh <u>on</u> Mendip, though Leigh <u>upon</u> Mendip appears on some weather, mapping and travel sites.

Make sure you pronounce it correctly!

The village is pronounced "lye" or "lie" rather than "lee", and probably comes from the Old English meaning grove or glade.

1 Amenities

Allotments

These are situated next to Coronation Park. They are restricted to parishioners and there is usually a waiting list. Further details and contact is here.

Bell Inn

- Real ale, skittles, darts, garden and restaurant.

Church

St Giles Church is part of a group of parishes that include: Downhead, Stoke St Michael and Postlebury (Nunney, Cloford, Marston, Wanstrow and Witham Friary). Holy Communion is celebrated at St Giles on the first Sunday of each month at 11am.

The Rev Keith Johnson is due to be licenced as the vicar by the Bishop in October 2025.



St Giles' Church is a Grade I building, dating from around 1350, and is dedicated to a French saint, a patron of cripples and beggars.

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) is responsible for the church and the one at Downhead. Community facilities include the <u>Tower Room Community café</u>, a Heritage Desk, WiFi and toilets.

The registered charity, <u>Friends of Leigh Church (FOLC)</u> actively assists the PCC with the substantial fundraising needed for ongoing maintenance.

There is an active band of <u>bell-ringers</u> who raised the funds to refurbish the bells in 2019.

Memorial Hall

Another wonderful facility in the village, allowing for many groups and activities.

The Memorial Hall is well equipped with a fully functioning kitchen, small meeting room, safe outside space and plenty of parking. Information on bookings, cost, capacity etc. is hemorial Hall is well equipped with a fully functioning kitchen, small meeting room, safe outside space and plenty of parking.

Many of the village meetings, exercise sessions and open social activities are held in the Memorial Hall. The <u>regular events</u> are here and other <u>events</u> are here.

The Memorial Hall is managed and supported by a voluntary group of people in the village who freely give their time and skills to ensure this facility is kept in good order for the rest of us. Your help will always be welcomed.

Recreation Field and Coronation Park

The <u>recreation field</u> and club house is a great facility in the village. The large open field can be used by villagers or visitors and is especially popular with families and young people for a variety of activities. There is also a basketball practice area, a practice football goal, picnic tables, a Pump Track and a shelter.



Recreation field activities include:

- Bowls in the summer months
- Football Coleford youth teams regularly use the pitches and welcome players from Leigh on Mendip.
- Village Events e.g. Summer Fair, Car Rally, Village Day



PLEASE do not allow your dog to foul the recreation field. ALL DOGS are now required to be on leads and any dog poo must be removed immediately. There are dog waste bins at both entrances.



Coronation Park is adjacent to the recreation field and has a wide variety of children's play equipment and exercise machines for the adults. There is a Sensory Garden with seating for anyone wanting to relax surrounded by floral, scented, textured flowers and herbs.

The recreation field, Coronation Park and club house are managed and supported by a voluntary group of people in the village who freely give their time and skills to ensure this facility is kept in good order for the rest of us. School and Child Care

Leigh on Mendip Primary School

The school is part of the Midsomer Norton Schools' Partnership. Offering an excellent village primary school for children aged from 4 years to 11 years. With a strong focus on 'nurturing curious minds', children are supported throughout

their learning. There are many extra curricular activities on offer including music lessons, various Sports clubs, Arts club & Chess Club.

Robins Preschool

Set within the school grounds, children from two years old are welcome to attend weekly sessions as part of our inclusive school community.

The preschool has a team of experienced staff and combines a small and caring atmosphere with an excellent and engaging curriculum. Children are able to learn and grow in a safe, creative and inspiring environment. Funding is accepted for all children above the age of two years.

Childminders

Matthew and Catherine Bennett have been acclaimed 'Outstanding' by Ofsted. Based in their own home in the village they offer childcare for children 6 months - school age. They provide "childcare in a very loving family environment which is safe, stimulating and above all fun". Tower Room Community Cafe

The <u>Tower Room Café</u> is in St Giles' Church, under the Tower and offers a peaceful place to rest, work, study or socialise. Drinks can be purchased on a self-serve basis, when the church is open (typically daylight hours). See <u>Events</u> for coffee mornings, cream teas etc.

There is free WiFi and a Heritage Desk to see the history of the church and search your village ancestors.

10 Services

Broadband Fibre to the Cabinet is available within the village from several suppliers. Download speeds vary from 96Mbps at the east end of the village gradually reducing speed towards the west. Full Fibre (<900Mbps) is available from Truespeed (available for free in the Church Tower Cafe).


