

Letter from the Bishop of Bath & Wells

Christmas joy for all people

We fear that we live in a world of increasing polarisation. Conflicts between and within nations play their part. The amplification of division and hostility by social media algorithms doesn't help. Culture wars exacerbate matters further. Sometimes it feels like common ground is disappearing from underneath our feet like a sandbar being overwhelmed by the tide.

In such a climate, it's good to return to the message that heralded the arrival of Jesus. 'I bring you tidings of great joy which shall be for <u>all</u> people' says that angel who announces the saviour's birth (Luke 2:10). Jesus' story quickly includes all types and sorts of humanity. From local shepherds to exotic visitors from afar. I wonder what the conversation was like as they all crammed into the stable to see the newborn child?

Jesus's story quickly shows that not only is he <u>for</u> all people but that he <u>needs</u> all people. His family must have needed assistance when they fled as refugees to Egypt. Jesus must have needed help when his parents left him behind on a family outing to Jerusalem aged twelve. Jesus was constantly calling on and engaging with others as he went about his teaching and ministry.

What might counter the polarisation of our day? Amongst our greatest resource is to seek out the emotion that accompanied the news of the saviour's birth – joy. When we encounter joy – from that cup winning goal to the marriage of much loved friends – such moments are never the time for division and enmity. We're all far too busy shouting and hugging each other! The invitation of Christmas is to experience such joy afresh. Often, we see joy most obviously in children's experience of the season. Might we seek it for ourselves too? For joy breaks down divisions, overcomes barriers, reminds us that we are one.

'I bring you tidings of great joy which shall be for <u>all</u> people' says the angel. A very merry and joyful Christmas to you all.

East Mendip Gardening Club

December is a quiet month in the garden, but there are more things to take care of than you might think. This month's crisp wintery weather can be strikingly beautiful and bitterly cold in equal measure.

Group potted plants together in a sheltered spot in the garden to protect them from the harshest winter weather.

Check climbers and climbing shrubs are securely attached to their supports with ties. Dig over empty borders and pile well rotted manure on top - let the worms and frosts break up the clods of soil.

Dig a trench for next year's beans, fill it with compostable kitchen waste (not cooked food) and re-cover with soil. This will rot down and dramatically improve the growing conditions.

Cover winter brassicas with netting to protect them from pigeons.

Lift and divide established clumps of rhubarb to renew the plant's vigour. Sections taken from the outside of the plant are better than those from the centre.

Apply glue bands or grease bands to the trunks of fruit trees to prevent wingless female winter moths climbing the trunks and laying their eggs in the branches.

If your strawberry plants are over 3 years old, order some new varieties to replace them. Old strawberries can harbour diseases and tend to lose vigour and productivity.

If you haven't already done so, clean out the greenhouse thoroughly. Wash the glass, the floor and the staging with horticultural disinfectant to kill any overwintering pests and diseases.

Work in some manure to greenhouse borders to prepare them for next spring. Leave enough space to add compost later on.

Propagate perennials from root cuttings including phlox, oriental poppies and mint.

Check the security of your shed. This is particularly important in winter when you visit it less often.

Get rid of slimy patches on the patio and paving by scrubbing with a broom or blasting with a pressure washer. For an easy alternative try a liquid patio cleaner.

Carefully plan your vegetable garden's crop rotation for next year to avoid a build up of pests and diseases.

Plant out indoor grown forced hyacinth bulbs in garden beds and borders after Christmas flowering is over. They will flower again next year.

Plant flowering bulbs in large pots of compost ready to fill any gaps in spring borders. Tulip bulbs are a great choice, they will still do well planted this late in the year.

Plant bare-root native hedging to encourage wildlife and create attractive boundaries around your garden

Sow onion 'Ailsa Craig' seeds on a sunny windowsill to give your exhibition-

worthy bulbs time to grow as big as possible.

Plant raspberry canes while they're dormant. Plant other berry fruits like blackberries any time between now and the spring.

Plant blueberries this winter for an attractive addition to the fruit garden. With pretty white flowers, delicious berries and fiery autumn foliage, these acid loving plants provide constant interest. If your soil is too alkali, try growing your blueberries in containers with ericaceous compost.

Request a catalogue to browse next month while the jobs in the garden slow down. Make a list of all the flowers, fruit & vegetables you want to grow in the New Year, and get ordering!

Take an inventory of tools and equipment that you need for next year. Add them to your Christmas list!

And in January use them it is the beginning of the gardening year – a time for fresh starts, renewed energy, and grand plans for the twelve months ahead. It might feel like a dormant month as far as growing is concerned, but there are a fair few flower seeds, fruit plants and vegetable seeds that can be started under glass. Sow Antirrhinum (snapdragons) in a propagator. These plants need a long growth period before flowering so sow now for the best results.

Start sowing Begonia semperflorens, geranium (Pelargonium) and Dianthus barbatus (Carnations/Pinks) for fantastic bedding displays in summer.

Grow potatoes in containers under cover in potato bags for a very early crop (Charlotte potatoes are a good variety for this).

Sow celeriac and celery in a heated propagator.

Grow your favourite herb seeds on your windowsill to bring colour and fragrance into your kitchen and provide fresh greens early in the year.

Sow broad bean 'The Sutton' in pots now. Keep the pots in a cold frame or unheated greenhouse.


