1.1 Scope

This accessibility statement applies to www.leigh-on-mendip.org.uk .

This website is run by Leigh-on-Mendip Parish Council. We want as many people as possible to be able to use this website. For example, that means you should be able to:

- change colours, contrast levels and fonts
- zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen
- navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- navigate most of the website using speech recognition software
- listen to most of the website using a screen reader

2. Technical information about this website's accessibility

Leigh-on-Mendip Parish Council is committed to making its website accessible in accordance with the Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018.

2.1 Compliance status

This website is compliant with the [Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version 2.2](#) AA standard.

The following are new Success Criteria in WCAG 2.2 AA since WCAG 2.1.

- Focus Not Obscured – Compliant (no sticky headers, pop-ups, or overlays etc.)
- Dragging Movements - Compliant (no dragging functions)
- Target Size - Compliant (no interactive targets)
- Consistent Help - Compliant (contact information and indexes on all pages)
- Redundant Entry - Compliant (users cannot enter data)
- Accessible Authentication - Compliant (no authentication processes)

This website was last tested on 9 February 2026. The test was carried out by Chris Cudmore on behalf of Leigh-on-Mendip Parish Council.

- Most relevant to the Parish Council (e.g. Agenda & Minutes)
- What's On / Events
- Includes HTML, PDF, tables
