Letter from Fiona Gibson, Bishop of Taunton

Transforming our communities through the love of Christ

In the early days of the Ukraine war, the Diocese of Hereford, where I was then serving, was approached by Herefordshire Council. They had been so impressed by the work of church members during the pandemic, who stepped up to support their communities in practical ways, that they asked if the diocese could take on organising homes for Ukrainians fleeing the war. Yes, of course, we said. And so began an ongoing partnership, where hundreds of Ukrainian guests have found homes in the Welsh Marches, and hundreds of tonnes of aid has gone across to Ukraine.

That's just what we do as the church, isn't it? We see a need in our communities and, motivated by Christ's love and teaching, we try to meet it. And we do it out of love, not seeking any reward. We are volunteers.

The word 'volunteer' comes from words meaning, 'of a person's free will.' Volunteers serve willingly. Freely. Out of love. So many in across our diocese serve our communities willingly, freely, out of love. We are deeply grateful. There are Foodbanks, lunch clubs, debt counselling services, mental health first aiders, bereavement cafes, after-school clubs, and youth drop-ins. That barely scratches the surface. All of this is done in the name of Jesus Christ, the one who came and gave himself for us willingly; freely; out of love. And it's transformational.

One of the areas of our common diocesan life which I'll be involved with is our work around Transforming Communities. There will be a lot more to be said in the coming months, but for now, I simply want to thank all our volunteers who serve willingly, freely, and out of love and say how much I'm looking forward to celebrating what we have, and building on it together, transforming our communities through the love of Christ.

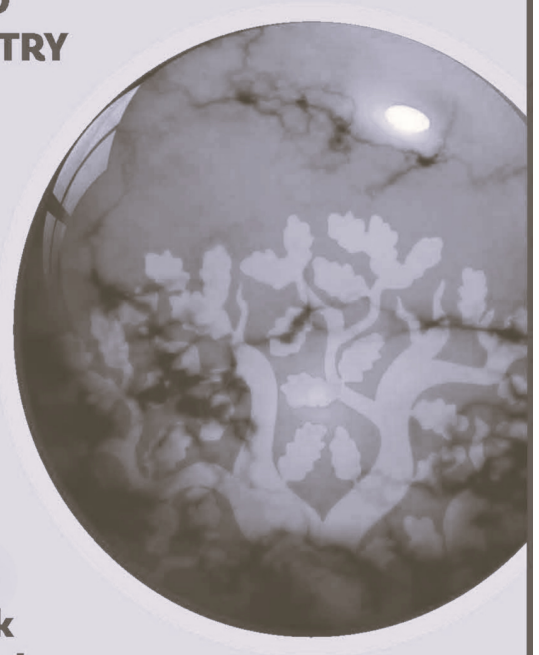

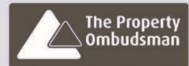

East Mendip Gardening Club

There's plenty of jobs to keep you busy in the garden in June, but also plenty to sit back and enjoy! With the longest day bringing extra hours of warmth and sunshine, and you can start planting in earnest.

Nasturtiums are easy to grow in containers or direct sowings, and quick to flower — use them in beds, containers, baskets, and the vegetable plot.

Scatter nigella seeds in your borders now for some striking blue late-summer flowers.

Grow the tallest sunflower from direct sowings — great fun for the kids! It might seem a bit early, but start thinking about spring flowers for next year.

Sow perennial seeds such as aquilegia, bellis, Canterbury bells, delphiniums and lupins indoors for flowering next year. It might seem a bit early, but start thinking about spring flowers for next year.

Now's the time to plant out patio shrubs and patio plants, such as hardy fuchsias and arums.

Lift and divide clumps of snowdrops and bluebells once the leaves start to yellow.

Dead-head and cut back oriental poppies after flowering. Cutting them close to ground level will stimulate new foliage.

Keep an eye out for scarlet lily beetles on your lilies — remove and crush any you see. Also check for the sticky brown larvae on the underside of leaves.

Towards the end of June, if your hardy geraniums have finished flowering, cut them back to encourage new foliage and flowers.

Harvest flower heads from your lavender plants to use in baking, crafting, or as a garnish to your meals.

There's still time to grow runner beans and french beans — sow them directly in the ground now.

Sow spring onion seeds in drills outdoors for a quick crop to add to salads and stir fries.

Sow broccoli and calabrese now in a nursery bed, for transplanting later on, or sow directly in your vegetable plot.

Sow pea seeds directly into the ground or start them off in modules if mice are a problem. Allow about 20 plants per person.

Plant your Brussels sprout plants deeply in the soil and earth them up as they grow for stability.

Plant out summer cabbages about 35cm (14in) apart.

Plant out cauliflowers into moist soil, and be sure not to allow the soil to dry out during growth.

Plant out pepper plants into grow-bags in a sheltered, sunny position.

Harvest salad crops, and resow every 2 weeks for a constant supply of tasty leaves.

Start to prune your plum or cherry trees now.

If you have plants fruiting in containers, remember to give them a high potash liquid feed to keep them healthy and productive.

Always water potted blueberry plants with rainwater, as the lime contained in tap water reduces the acidity of the soil over time.

Make small 'wells' around individual plants so that the water can soak the soil to about 25cm (10in). Merely wetting the surface wastes water, encourages weeds and can lead to surface rooting making plants more vulnerable.

Keep on top of weeding. Your plants shouldn't have to compete for precious water, light, and nutrients.

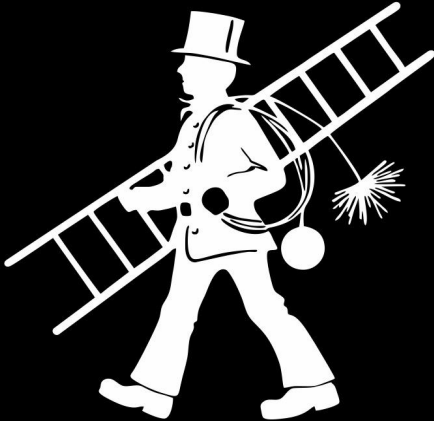
